At Fox Hollow teachers are focused on high quality instruction and doing what's best for students. The TSSA plan from last year set goals around the district and state literacy goals to increase literacy performance using district programs-Heggerty, state programs-Acadience (for all grade levels) and instructional coaches to work with teachers and PLCs. Two instructional coaches were hired to work with faculty members to assist in the implementation of strategies such as engagement. Teachers collaborated and selected strategies to implement during PLCs. We are going to continue to use two instructional coaches to continue to work with teachers on using high yield strategies during Tier I instruction and provide professional development for faculty members.
